Dear Mr Galligan,

Thank you for your letter of 3rd November regarding Canegrowers Advocacy Agenda and One Nation's views on these issues.

Thank you for seeking our comments.

Should One Nation be successful at the upcoming election and have influence over policy within the new Government, we would commit to the following:

Q1 Energy Prices: We have committed to the construction of new coal fired generation in North Queensland and will also seek reform of the sector to reduce power prices.

Q2 Market Reform: We are on record as opposing the market bullying that the sugar industry has been subject to and would seek immediate action by Government to the current situation to ensure grower choice and competition in marketing services.

Q3 Local Management: One Nation has committed to regionalisation of Government decision making and reduction in the reach of Brisbane-centric bureaucracy.

Q4 Regionalisation: One Nation has committed to cancelling the Cross River Rail project in Brisbane and to redirecting the \$5billion in savings to infrastructure projects throughout the State. Power and water infrastructure and road and bridge infrastructure in regional Queensland will build the economy rather than saving Brisbane commuters 8 minutes on their daily commute.

Q4 Industry Sustainability: One Nation supports and will expand on support for industry innovation. Programs that are self-managed and effective such as river bank repair, targeted reduction in fertiliser application and best practise farming will be supported.

Q5 Regulatory Reform: One Nation will work with Canegrowers on necessary regulatory reform. We are unashamedly supportive of the farming sector and believe that the Queensland economy and job creation is crucially dependent upon our rural communities.

I would like to meet with your organisation immediately following the election, should I have the good fortune of being re-elected.
